My concentration went beyond the basic pre-law course of study, and focused on issues relevant to labor law in the United States: law under the National Labor Relations Act, employment law, arbitration, contract negotiation, and organizing.

The labor courses provided the background necessary to understand this complex body of law, while the political science and legal studies courses gave me the prerequisite background to better understand these legal issues. In addition, the sociology and philosophy courses gave me a broader context to understand the law.
