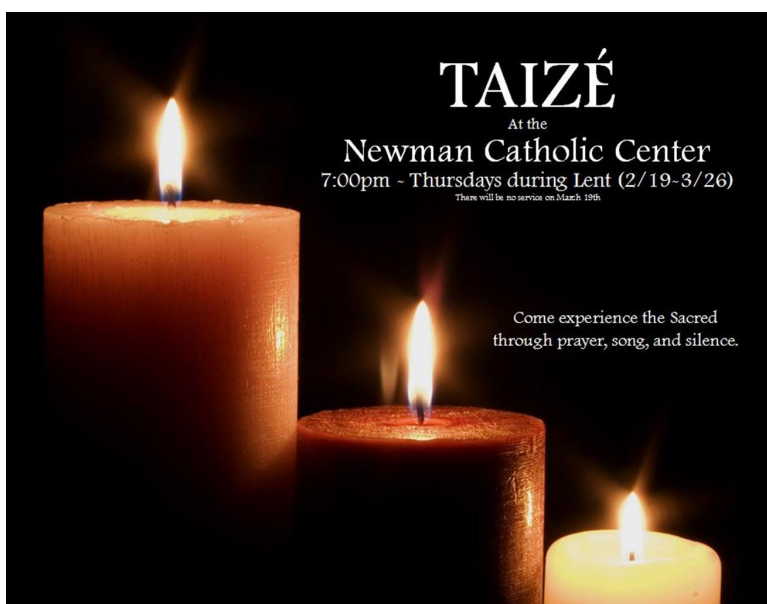

Men of all ages are encouraged to attend the weekly MOSJ.

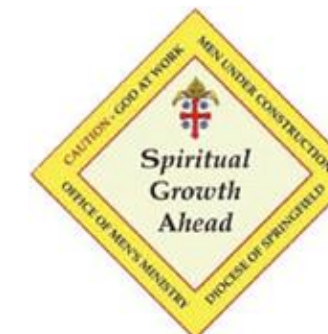


Confirmation
