After traveling to an island off the coast of Maine, she finds a job as an animal control officer and rescues a black dog whose benign ways quietly affect each character in the novel. When you read the book, you'll meet the grieving widow who clings to the scent of her husband's pillow, the anorexic neighbor-girl (with her "abandoned quarry" of a stomach), the unusually sensitive island woman, and the private archery teacher. A struggle for survival connects them all.
