The Educator Advocate (EA) program is one branch of Every Woman's Center's Community Education Program. Campus and community volunteers participate in an intense 60+ hour training to be able to provide educational services on topics related to sexual violence and relationship violence. Why is asking for consent important? When should I ask for consent? And how do I do it? What is consent? And what isn't? This interactive workshop explores answers to all these questions and more.

Building Healthy Relationships

Compared to the number of hours we've spent learning calculus, chemistry, and languages, most of us spend close to no time learning about relationships. Whether you are in a relationship, wish you knew how to get into one, or desperately want to get out of one, this interactive workshop can help you get there.

Standing By or Standing Up?

Concerned about sexual violence? We are too. There are many ways that individuals can make a difference, whether they are at a party or in a private residence. Through the use of scenarios, this program explores the many ways each of us can take action to intervene or prevent sexual violence.

Sexual Assault 101

This interactive workshop is an introduction to sexual assault—what it is and how it affects people. We'll also debunk some common myths about sexual assault.
