- Open to all subject matters
- Original work, no copies of published images
- 3 works only
- Open to residents of the 50 states

### Selection

Selection will be necessary due to gallery space limitation. The selection committee will try to include as many works as possible.

### Conditions

- Mediums accepted - 2D, 3D, video, written word
- Works must be properly framed, with attached wire ready to hang
- Weight limit of 60 lbs
- Artwork must be delivered by hand at the specified location and dates. No delivery or return of artworks by mail.

### Entry Procedure

- Print and fill out entry form
- Include an artist statement or a brief description of your military service
- Include 3 images on a CD, jpeg format
- CD will not be returned
- No Entry Fee
