

CHANGE OF STATUS INSTRUCTIONS

J-1 TO F-1

Submit the following documents, in the order listed below, to United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS):

1. Check for \$370 payable to "Department of Homeland Security"
2. Form I-539 completed (www.uscis.gov/sites/default/files/files/form/i-539.pdf)
3. Copy of receipt for new \$200 SEVIS I-901 Fee (www.fmjfee.com/)
4. Copy of your F-1 I-20 form (signed & dated by you at bottom)
5. Print out of your I-94 arrival record (<https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/i94/#/home>)
6. Copy of photo identification page in passport **and** J-1 visa stamp. **DO NOT SEND YOUR ORIGINAL PASSPORT**
7. Copies of all of your previous J-1 DS-2019 forms
8. Proof of finances that supports the financial details on your I-20 form
9. Copy of UMass acceptance letter
10. **If you were previously subject to Section 212(e), otherwise known as the 2-Year Home Residency Requirement**, you will also need to submit proof that this requirement has been waived by the United States State Department ("no objection" letter).
11. *Recommended:* A brief written statement explaining in detail the reason for your change of status request and why you did not apply for an F-1 visa in your own country.

Remember:

1. This procedure only changes your immigration status **inside the US**. A change of status does not provide you with a new visa stamp in your passport. Once approved you will still need a valid F-1 visa stamp for any future travel and re-entry to the US. US visas may only be obtained at a US consulate abroad.
2. You **may not** depart the US while your change of status application is pending. If you do, your application will be considered abandoned and canceled and no refund will be given.
