**Deadline** for receipt of abstracts: **January 22, 2002.**

[Target decision date: February 20, 2002]

Abstracts are invited for **30**-minute presentations (plus 10 minutes discussion) on topics dealing with formal aspects of any area of theoretical Slavic linguistics (synchronic or diachronic), including syntax, semantics, morphology, phonology, discourse analysis, and psycholinguistics. Limit one individual abstract plus one joint abstract per author.

Send 6 copies of a ONE-PAGE ANONYMOUS abstract, with one optional additional page for examples, to the postal address below. No fax submissions will be accepted.

Please attach ONE 3x5 card [or a separate sheet of paper] with:

- 1) title of paper
- 2) author's name(s)
- 3) address and affiliation
- 4) telephone and/or fax numbers
- 5) e-mail address

(Authors are advised to re-check examples and glosses with speakers of the languages involved.)
