MUSIC HISTORY

Position: Assistant Professor of Music History, music history pedagogy specialist. Tenure-track.

Salary: Commensurate with Assistant Professor rank.

Required qualifications: Ph.D. in music history, musicology, or other relevant field required.

Preferred qualifications: A record of accomplishment in the field of music history pedagogy; a record of accomplishment in one or more of the following music-historical subfields: nineteenth-century music, early twentieth-century music, the “new” interdisciplinary musicology, American music; and additional evidence of excellence as a teacher and scholar.

Responsibilities: (a) *Research:* establish the University of Massachusetts Amherst as a center of excellence in the field of music history pedagogy, to complement its recognized excellence in the field of music theory pedagogy; (b) *Teaching:* teach the Western Art Music History sequence for majors, writing about music class, and graduate music history seminars in areas of expertise; (c) *Service:* serve on graduate committees, assist with recruiting and advising, particularly in the graduate area; serve on department committees and perform other appropriate university and professional service. Position is expected to begin September 1, 2012.
