Dr. Eleanor Vanetzian, Director of the Office of Nursing Scholarship has announced her plans to retire as of the beginning of the Fall semester, 2005. Through Ellie's expert guidance, the School has steadily increased its scholarly productivity over the past two years. The Dean's office is actively searching for a fulltime Associate Dean of Research, to be hired as soon as possible. During the Interim period, Dr. Priscilla Clarkson, Associate Dean for Research for the School of Public Health and Health Sciences will serve as the Interim Associate Dean for Research for the School of Nursing until a new Associate Dean is hired.

Priscilla is an experienced researcher in the area of muscle soreness, function, and exercise-induced muscle damage. In 30 years she has given nearly 300 invited professional presentations at regional, national, and international meetings. She has published over 185 scholarly manuscripts in national and international journals. Priscilla's career accomplishments are many and this past Spring she received the Honor Award from the American College of Sports Medicine for providing outstanding scientific and scholarly contributions to sports medicine and the exercise sciences. She is only the second woman to have received this award from this International organization.
