Note 1. **Student Majors:** A student with a declared major within the department or program. At the undergraduate level, data reported represent a duplicated count of student majors (primary and secondary majors). FTE student majors are distributed proportionally across major programs. Therefore, numbers are not comparable to semesters prior to Spring 1996, which reported data for primary majors only. See Enrollment Definitions for additional detail.

Note 2. **Active:** Matriculating graduate students registered for courses or dissertation credits.

Note 3. **Program Fee (PF):** Matriculating graduate students assigned three credits while on Program Fee (no course).

Note 4. **Primary Majors:** The actual count of undergraduate students whose primary declared major is in the department or program.

Note 5. **Secondary Majors:** The actual count of undergraduate students whose secondary or tertiary declared major is in the department or program.

Note 6. **CE.** Non-state supported graduate program administered through the Division of Continuing Education.

Note 7. All data reflect the current organizational structure.

Note 8. Excludes undergraduate students on exchange at other institutions.
