Diverse Democracy Survey of Fall 2000 Entering First-Year Students
Frequency Distributions by Race/Ethnicity

Project Description: UMass Amherst is currently one of nine public research universities participating in the Diverse Democracy Project, a national study examining the relationship between diversity and learning on college campuses. An important component of the Diverse Democracy Project is a longitudinal survey of first-year students who entered UMass Amherst in the Fall of 2000. A baseline survey was administered to 3,077 students who attended the New Students Program in the Summer of 2000 (a follow-up survey is scheduled for the Spring of 2002). The baseline survey results presented in this document provide valuable information on the background characteristics, experiences, and expectations for college of over 80% of the Fall 2000 entering class.
