

2023 Entering Student Survey

Selected Items for Transfer Students

Over the summer of 2023, OAPA was able to conduct the Entering Student Survey (ESS) for the first time since 2019. The survey was conducted entirely online from June 6th to September 5th. The response rate for transfer students was 22% (n=281). This report presents overall results for selected survey items. Results are shown separately for women (W) and men (M) if the difference between groups was 10 or more percentage points.



52% of women and 26% of men have seen a mental health professional in the past year



75% of students have concern about their ability to finance their college education



6% of students are a parent, guardian, or primary caretaker of a dependent child
