UMass Amherst/WBZ Poll of NH Registered/Likely Voters

Field Dates:	October 10 - October 15
Sample:	400 Registered New Hampshire Voters 322 Likely Voters
Margin of Error:	6.0% for Registered Voters 6.6% for Likely Voters

YouGov interviewed 453 respondents who were then matched down to a sample of 400 to produce the final dataset. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, education, party identification, ideology, and political interest. The frame was constructed by stratified sampling from the full 2010 American Community Survey (ACS) sample with selection within strata by weighted sampling with replacements (using the person weights on the public use file). Data on voter registration status and turnout were matched to this frame using the November 2010 Current Population Survey. Data on interest in politics and party identification were then matched to this frame from the 2007 Pew Religious Life Survey. The matched cases were weighted to the sampling frame using propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, and ideology. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post-stratified according to these deciles.

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All results are for registered voters unless otherwise noted.
