INTENSIVE UNDERGRADUATE LANGUAGE AND CULTURE PROGRAM

(9 credits)

Six hours of daily instruction: language, composition, culture, and conversation (depending on level of proficiency).

Requirements for Application:
One semester of college-level Spanish or equivalent and a 2.5 average minimum.

ADVANCED UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM IN LITERATURE, LINGUISTICS AND CULTURE

(6 credits)

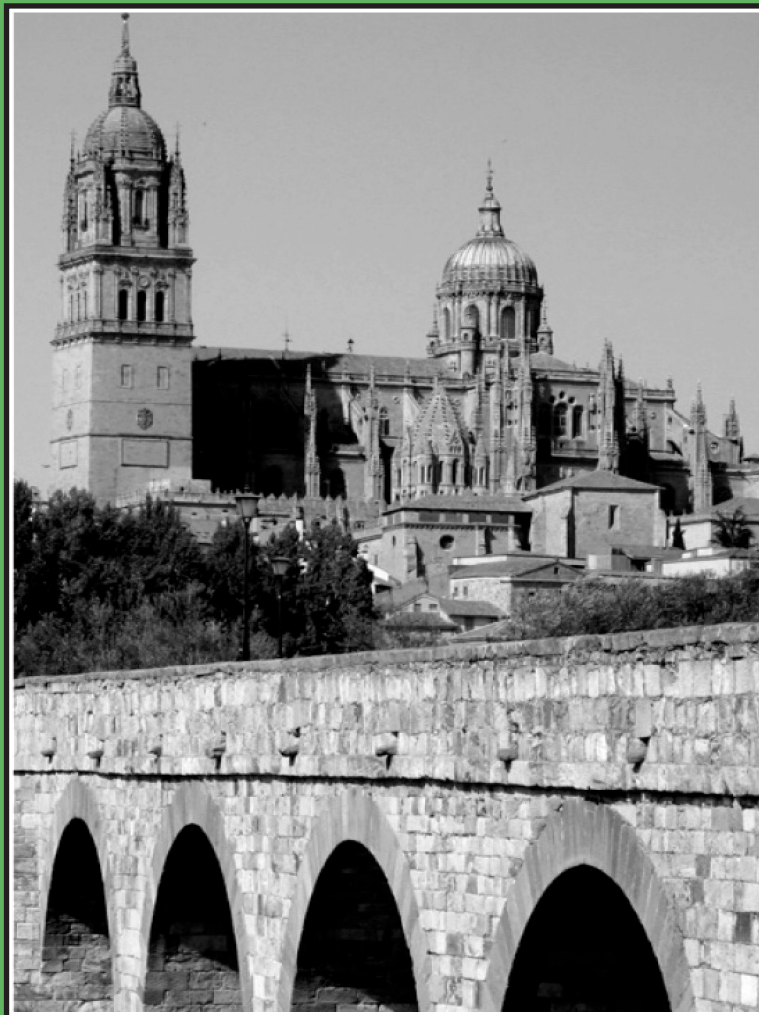
Two classes from the following list:

Spanish 497 FP
(SPAN-311 at UMass)
Fundamental Problems of Spanish Grammar
– 3 credits.

General view of basic structures of language. Course focuses on areas of Spanish syntax and morphology that are problematic for students of Spanish as a second language.

Spanish 497 CC
(SPAN-321 at UMass)
Introduction to Spanish Literature & Culture from the 18th to the 20th century
– 3 credits.

A survey of Spanish literature from the 18th to the 20th Century through a study of the most representative authors and works of each period and aesthetic movements. The course focuses also on the social and cultural contexts of the periods being studied. Representative poetry, narrative, drama will be examined.



Spanish 497 DD
(SPAN-323 at UMass)

Introduction to Contemporary Spanish American Literature & Culture – 3 credits.
Introduction to the literature of Spanish America from the end of the 19th century to the present. Emphasis on literary currents and their relation to history and culture of the period. Representative poetry, narrative, drama will be examined.

Spanish 497 QQ
(SPAN-415 at UMass)
Contemporary Spanish Culture – 3 credits.

A study of modern Spain in its political, social, religious and cultural aspects. Review of events, problems and cultural processes that have occurred in Spain and which have formed the identity of Spain in the last hundred years. Use different texts and audiovisual materials throughout the course.
