

A Basic Decision Table for Symptoms of Trees Infested by Asian Longhorned Beetle

1. *Is the tree a maple, elm, horsechestnut, birch, willow, poplar?*

No - not an Asian longhorned beetle host

Yes or don't know - proceed to question number 2

2. *Is there one or more perfectly round holes, over inch - in the tree or branch?*

No, the holes are smaller or irregular shaped - not Asian longhorned beetle

No holes visible - continue to question number 4

Yes - continue to question number 3

3. *Are the holes in a horizontal row?*

Yes - not Asian longhorned beetle, probably woodpecker damage

No - continue to question number 4

4. *If there is frass coming from the holes - is it like sawdust?*

Yes - not Asian longhorned beetle

No - it is coarse, like pencil shavings or miniature toothpicks - then it may possibly be Asian longhorned beetle
