 Be sure to label all paperwork for accurate placement of records.

1. A copy of your Graduate School Application: For matriculated applicants, a copy of your graduate school application can be obtained from your degree granting program office. Unofficial transcripts are acceptable but they must be up to date.
2. Letters of Reference: For current students, submit one(1) letter from an advisor or degree program faculty member; For in-coming students, submit one(1) letter from an advisor related to your area of study; For non-degree students, submit three(3) letters of reference.
3. Sample of Written Scholarly Work: Can be a research paper, published article or critical review, and preferably one that includes a feminist analysis.
4. Final Project Research Form: Completed form with necessary signatures of committee members.
4. Respond in writing to both of the following:
 - A. **Feminist Background:** Describe your background in feminist scholarship and/or activism with women's issues. List coursework, academic development, field and international travel experiences, community activism, and other relevant information.
 - B. **Personal Statement:** What are your research interests? Outline your plan of study and discuss how the coursework requirements of the Certificate in Advanced Feminist Studies will influence your disciplinary research. In particular, discuss how your research will benefit from interdisciplinary methods and an integrative analysis (locating women and gender in its intersections with race, ethnicity, class, sexuality nationality and other relevant social processes).
