HISTORY & PROJECTS

Founded in 1968, the Center for International Education (CIE) is part of the College of Education at the UMASS Amherst. Historically, CIE has had two major functions: 1) to solicit and manage externally-funded research studies and education development projects; and 2) to simultaneously serve as a learning community for associated graduate students interested in working to develop educational systems around the world- particularly in low-resource settings and those afflicted by conflict and crisis.

The Center in partnership with governments and non-government agencies seeks to address the global challenges of:

- War & conflict (including domestic violence)
- · Mass migration
- · Disparity of poverty & wealth
- · Inequity & access to education, especially for girls
- · Climate change

Faculty, staff and graduate students work together in teams utilizing a critical, rigorous, and interdisciplinary approach to dealing with the most complex challenges of our time as we seek out and manage funded projects.
