Center for Counselling and Psychological Health at 545-2337 is an interdisciplinary counseling service, staffed by licensed mental health providers, including social workers, psychologists, psychiatrists and clinical nurse specialists.

The Dean of Students Office at 545-2684 provides several services to the campus community. The staff is available to answer questions, advocate on behalf of students, and to connect students and their families to appropriate resources to get the information they need. This is also the place to make complaints about student conduct, including issues related to the campus climate.
