#### 2024-2025

• Switched EDUC 326 and EDUC 328 in course sequence. Moved 326 to Fall of Sr. year and 328 to Fall of Jr. year.

2023-2024: Students were enrolled in 398G for 6 credits and 500Y for 12 credits.
