⁴ This list includes **possible elective courses** aimed at supporting area of specialization (e.g., site of practice, content area, research methods) and are selected in conjunction with graduate advisor guidance.

⁵ In this 3 credit elective practicum course, students work closely with their academic advisor using the concentration internship guidelines to develop an independent practicum contract.
