Public engagement and outreach goal-setting

Develop a short list of goals for 2019

The more specific the better (e.g., write two blog posts, give a public lecture, start a weekly podcast)

Identify key barriers that might get in your way

Again, be specific (e.g., time constraints, being maxed out energy-wise, necessary skills you don't yet have)

Public engagement and outreach goal-setting

What sources of support do you have to overcome these barriers? Think about who, what, where, how, etc. (e.g., leveraging your personal network; trainings and workshops to build skills)

Create an implementation plan

List all of the concrete steps you'll need to take—and when you'll take them—in order to achieve the goals you wrote above (e.g., "talk to my advisor next week," "sign up for OPD training in May," "write bullet points for op-ed today")
