The Critical Social Studies Workshop calls for papers to be presented for the 2019 Fall semester. Please share this email with all who may be interested.

Formed in Fall 2017 as an interdisciplinary forum, we are open to any topic, methodology, scale of analysis, time period, place, etc. Theoretically, too, we welcome diverse approaches, but we do insist that they be critical. In particular, our central consideration is 'power' such as (but not limited to) imperialism, coloniality, nation, race, gender, and class in manifestation.

The typical format of the workshop is an intensive discussion of a work in progress -- at whatever stage of preparation but preferably not close to the final draft -- to be circulated in advance. The point of the workshop is to facilitate the further development and improvement of research projects, not to showcase them. Please note that we welcome less developed works over fully developed ones.
