At the 446th meeting of the Faculty Senate, concerns were raised about the absence of a disciplinary process for those who were found to have violated the Senate's Procedures for Dealing with Charges of Misconduct in Scholarly Activities at the University of Massachusetts/Amherst (Sen. Doc. No. 90-038). It was the sense of the Senate that such a process should be established.

The Rules Committee therefore proposes that an ad hoc committee be set up to recommend a comprehensive disciplinary process to the Faculty Senate.

MOVED: That the Faculty Senate establish an ad hoc Committee to Recommend
41-90 Disciplinary Procedures for Those Found to Have Engaged in Misconduct in Scholarly Activities (described in Sen. Doc. No. 90-038) presented in Sen. Doc. No. 90-044.

The membership of this committee shall be: two members of the Senate's Academic Personnel Policy Committee appointed by the chair, two members of the Research Council appointed by the chair, one member of the Executive Board of the Massachusetts Society of Professors appointed by the President of MSP, the Ombudsperson or designee.

The committee shall submit its final report with recommendations to the Rules Committee of the Faculty Senate no later than the last day of May 1990.
