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SUMMARY

My work primarily explores the various strategies marginalized families and communities develop and use to negotiate and overcome the challenges they confront across social institutions and systems. Using narrative, ethnographic, community-engagement, and visual methods, my research program includes: (1) children's mental health and mental health services delivery, (2) mass incarceration and community-based alternatives to incarceration, (3) 'living archives,' and (4) public health and bioethical implications of genomics, genomics research, and emerging biomedical technologies.

DISSERTATION SUMMARY

This two-year urban ethnographic field study broadly examines health and illness at the intersection of race, gender, and poverty within and across woman-headed African American families living in an inner city public housing community. Drawing from participant-observation and in-depth interviews with community residents, educators, and clinicians, life history interviews with mothers, archival reviews, and policy analyses, I investigate, in part, how social, biomedical, institutional, and legal discourses surrounding childhood mental illness not only impair families' fundamental health needs, but also become a generative source of meaning, identity, and resistance in family, community, and cultural life. Analytically, I draw from Hill Collins' standpoint theory to trace how these discourses are intimately linked to mothers' strategies to both protect and ensure survival of their children.
