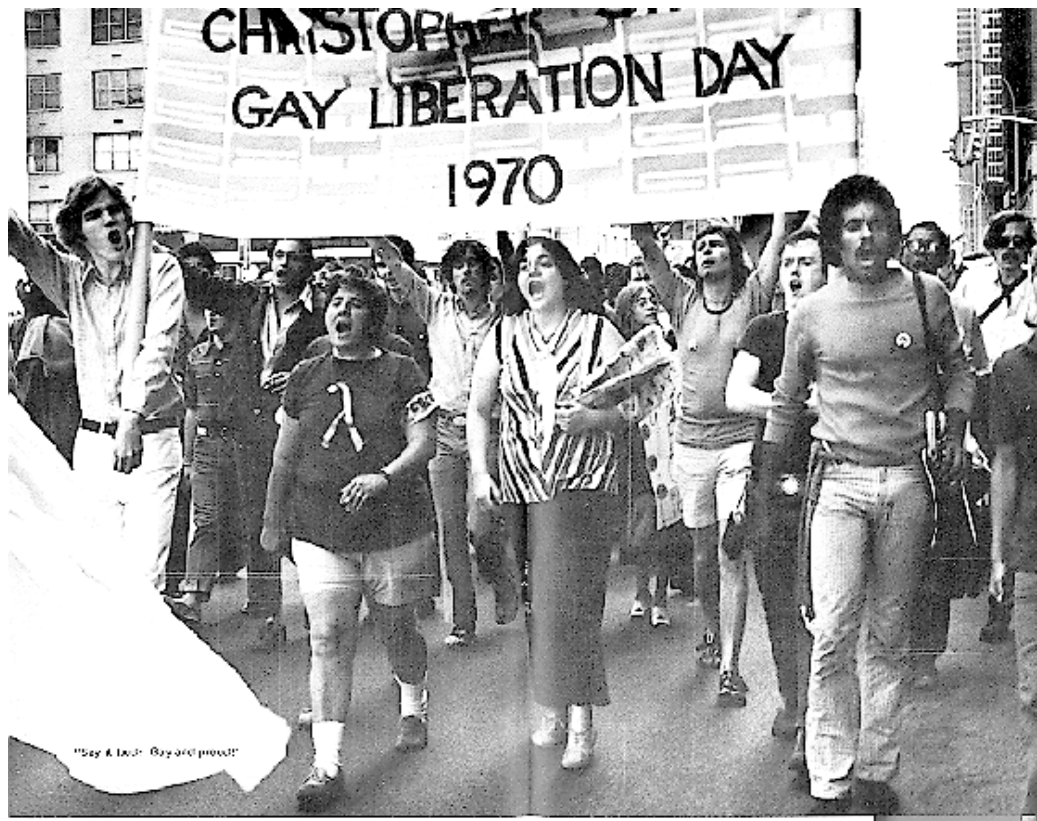

# To What Does Stonewall Refer?

On July 27, 1969, police raided the Stonewall Inn, a popular gay bar in New York City. The Stonewall patrons fought back against the police, and protests and rallies followed in the days after the raid.

These demonstrations marked the beginning of the modern LGBT rights movement.



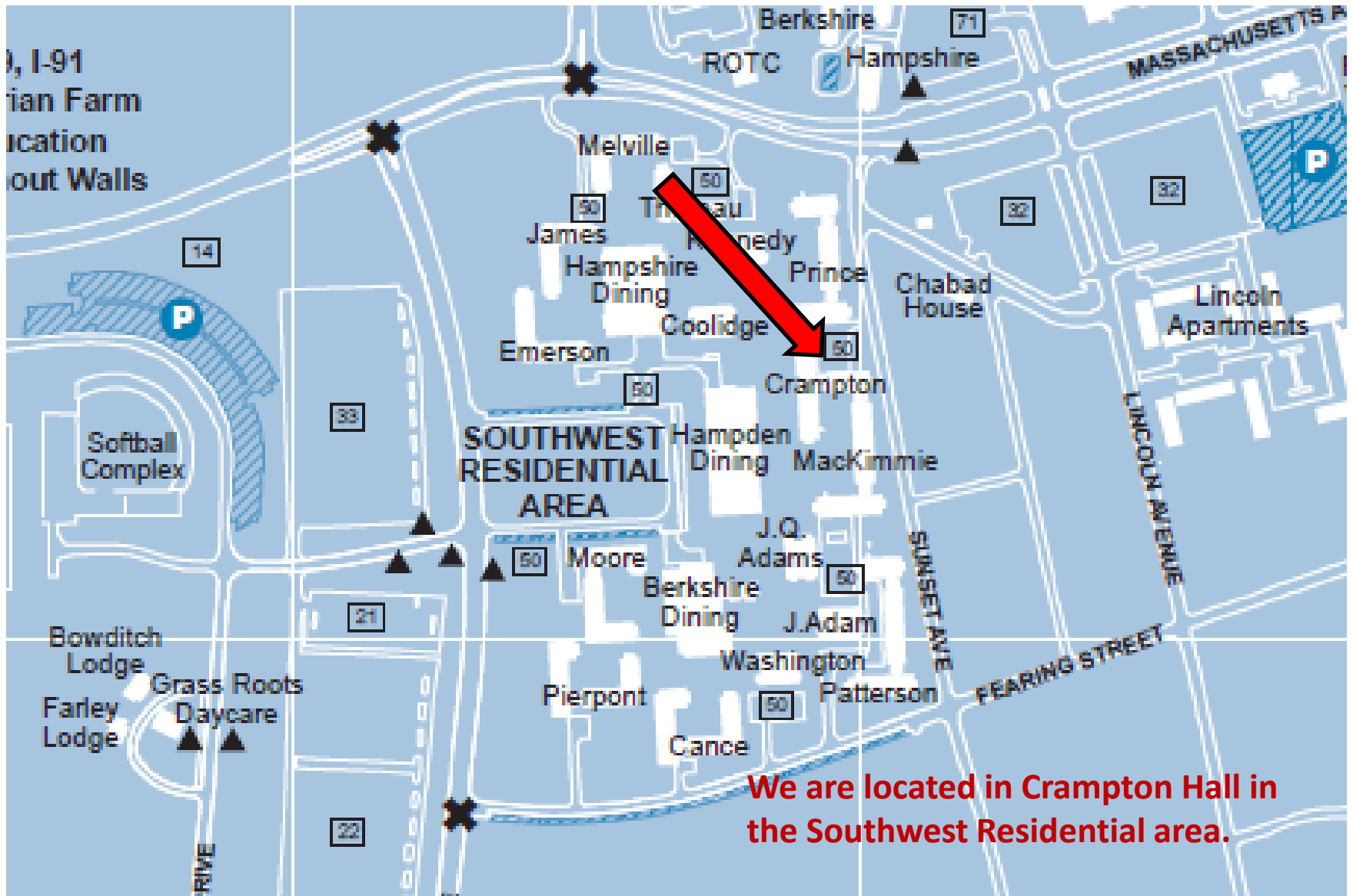
# About the UMass Stonewall Center

- Free and Anonymous HIV and STD Testing

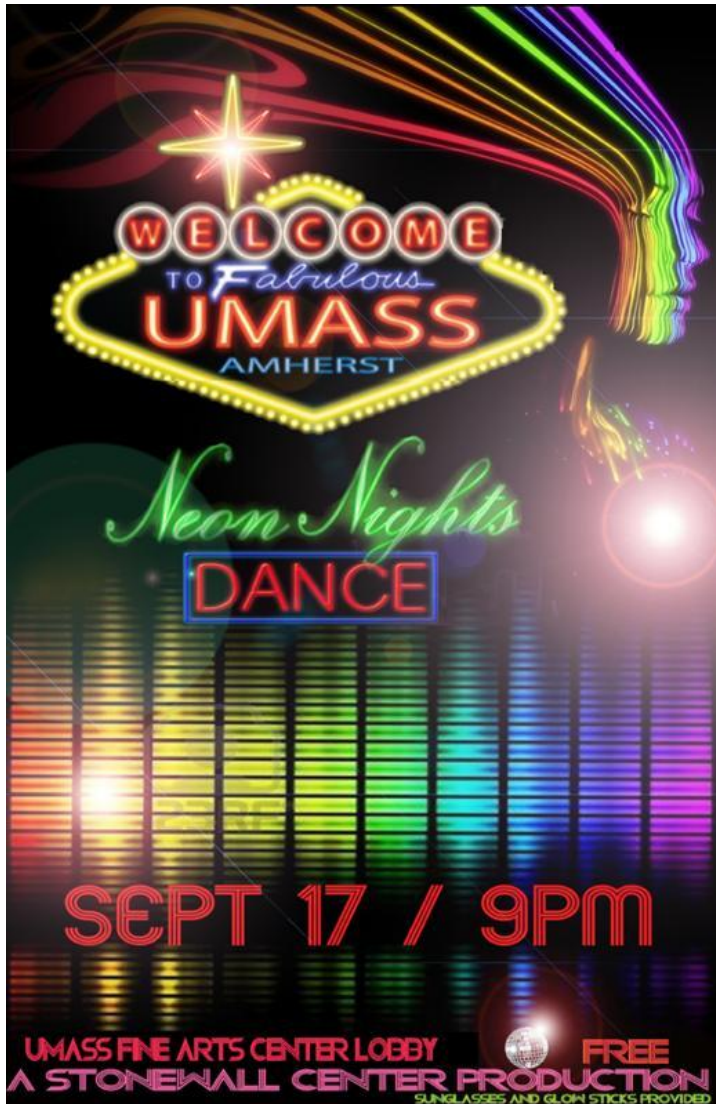


# Stonewall Center Services
