Cluster Workshop – Focus on Student Engagement

Goal: Clearly identify and articulate our intended "target audience(s)"

- Who are the students that our department or cluster serves <u>directly</u>?
 - Who are the students that we directly serve via our services, our programs, our activities, etc.?
 - Identify <u>specific</u> groupings of students, as needed!

Goal: Clearly identify and articulate our current actual audience(s)

- Who are the students that currently engage with our services and/or participate in our programs <u>directly</u>?
 - Again be specific! Identify the specific groupings of students that currently, actively engage

Cluster Workshop – Focus on Student Engagement

Goal: Clearly identify and articulate our engagement goal(s) for each target audience that we serve directly

 How do we want each identified target audience to engage with our services, programs, activities, etc?
